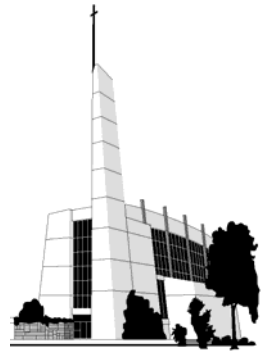

Back to Church Sunday, September 13th !

On Sunday, September 13th, as we all return to church from the travels of the summer, we will have the opportunity to join with Methodists across the country to support an important mission project, Imagine No Malaria. Did you know that Malaria costs Sub Sahara Africa an estimated \$12 billion in local economic

productivity, education, and communication? Imagine No Malaria is working to fight malaria and disrupt the cycle of poverty. Imagine No Malaria is a ministry aimed at raising \$75 million toward the elimination of Malaria in Africa. The key pillars of this program will continue to focus on the distribution of treated mosquito nets, Education about malaria, establishment of community based malaria control programs, outreach, and the revitalization of hospitals and clinics across the continent. This is our a chance to help eradicate this treatable disease which claims millions of lives across the developing world. Our goal in the California Pacific Annual Conference is to raise \$3 million in the coming months and we are about halfway to that goal. So, as a change from our traditional rally day activities, we will launch a campaign to contribute to this important project!

The day's activities will include:

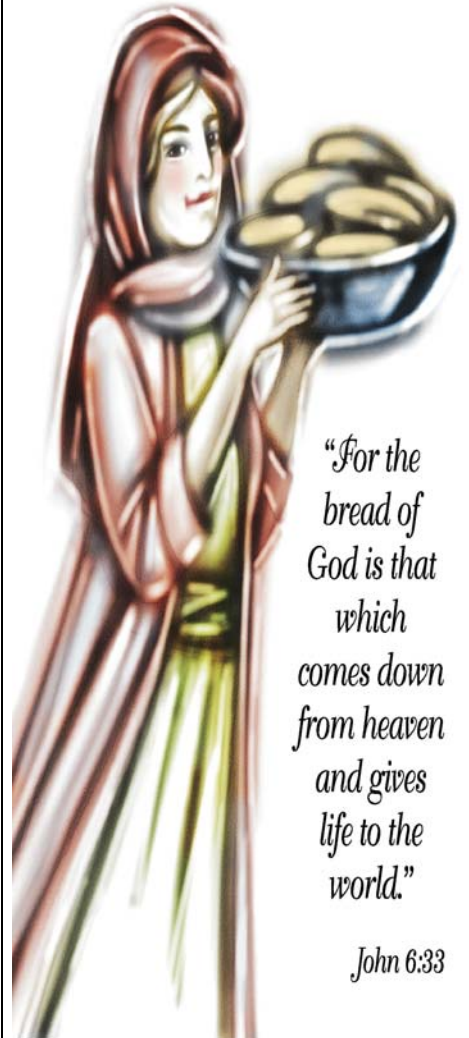

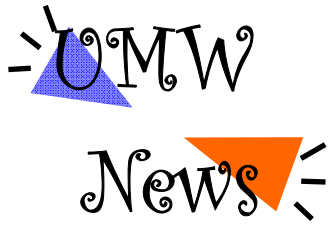

FROM THE ORGAN LOFT

This time we are going to bring up some trivia, things people usually ask about when faced with such a large instrument and a “forest” of pipes. Legitimate questions to which there are legitimate and simple answers. But, before, I shall mention that some people asked me, your humble organist, if I’m the one writing this column. Of course I am! Who else could do it better? (In fact, a lot of people, but I’m glad the argentine accent does not show in print!). Now to the trivia and some facts:

Q. How tall is the tallest pipe?

A. 16 feet high. (Low C, of the Principal 16’ in the Pedal division.

Q. How small is the smallest?

A. About 1/2 inch and there are several of them in different Stops.

Q. How does a tiny pipe stay upright and not blown away by the wind pressure?

A. Beside lots of pipes there are lots of holes in the organ that allow the passage of wind pressure, and these holes vary in size. Every pipe has what’s called a “foot” an inverted cone extension of various lengths from the “mouth” down. These “feet” have “toe-holes” that seat on the valves that open a close to make them sound. The pipes seat on rackboard holes that support them upright.

Q. How do you tune 2,659 pipes and how often do they need it?

A. The whole organ does not go out-of-tune at the same time. Parts of it do, for various reasons, the main one being changes in temperature. A heat wave can wreak havoc with the tuning especially in a windowless building like ours, and where divisions are at different levels.

Some pipes come back in tune when it cools down but some won’t. The organ is tuned with the change of seasons, and only the pipes that need to be tuned. In Garden Grove, before it gets too hot and before it gets too cold and for some special occasions. The organist is “tuned in” to the changes every time he plays it. He makes notes of what needs to be done for the organ tuner.

To simplify: The organ pipes consist of 80% “Flues” that is: Principals, Flutes, Strings and Mixtures. The other 20% consist of “Reeds”: Trumpet, Oboe, Fagot, Krummhorn. The 80% is the most sensitive to temperature changes. If they move, they move together. Therefore, we tune the 20% to match the 80% in order to save time and money! This is what is done every time, with some variations!

Next time: 50 years of dust and wear and tear . . . and did you know that the organist is likely to play 500.000 notes each Sunday morning? Stay “tuned!”
