




The Church office will be closed in observance of the Christmas and New Year's Holidays.



OUR CHURCH HELPS US HAVE A HEALTHY BRAIN 11/20/23

Recently, I experienced a medical scare related to memory issues. Terror struck as the problem seemed to get worse and worse. What if this was the beginning of *Dementia*?

Wait! Prayers must come first!

Then, I began to look for causes and fortunately, soon learned that a relatively common, recently prescribed pain medication may cause "trouble with thinking." (Mayo Clinic) Within a week after stopping the drug, I noticed improvement and was soon back to my regular "age-related" thinking.

This event started my thinking about the many ways our Church benefits brain health.

Our Church is:

A spiritual home replete with opportunities to worship God and follow his son Jesus Christ.

A community to <u>receive</u> support, prayers, and love from friends.

A place to <u>learn</u> new spiritual insights from wise and knowledgeable preachers.

A conduit to <u>connect</u> with our Heavenly Father.

A spiritual home to share financial blessings and feel the joy of giving to safe and honest causes.

An opportunity to socialize, which is a paramount source of brain health.

A chance to use productive physical activity to support events such as church clean-ups.

A space to <u>provide help</u> to others since every effort, no matter how small, is as beneficial to the helper as to those helped.

An environment to practice <u>listening</u> carefully. (Hearing is incredibly important for brain function *and* balance.)

A respite from the troubles of the world. One only needs to *read* the news to be reminded of the need for peace. (*Reading* a daily newspaper engages more brain cells than mindless TV watching.)

Let us thank God for sending his Son, Jesus, for our salvation and joyfully receive the bounties of our church with its blessings of HEALTH and peace.

WIFI/KITCHEN/HOMELESS were the three topics, all with almost impossible answers, which struck me as major problems facing the Trustees at our last meeting.

#1 Wi-Fi (wireless communication between computers, phone, and printers) should NOT be a problem for us. We have bonified experts, Ed Papp, and Larry Ogle. However, Wi-Fi can't get through the 10 to 20 inch poured concrete walls of our church and outbuildings made of 9-inch cinder blocks filled with concrete, reinforced with rebar. We need to give our experts time and prayerful support as they strive to adapt our aging facility to this required equipment.

#2 The kitchen has been left in a disreputable state, which required hard labor cleanup (thanks Larry and Gerry). We are trying to fairly identify the perpetrators, stop the problems, and create plans to mitigate them in the future.

#3 The homeless people engender our sympathies for their plight. But their use of our grounds as a depository for their excrement and trash, storage for their belongings, and as a night-time music recreational facility, is not acceptable to us or our neighbors, who have called the police several times. As we pursue solutions, please do not approach the homeless. Call the non-emergency police line at (714) 741 5704 and request a patrol officer to escort the person(s) from our church campus.


My thoughts:


