### **Trustees' Times Newsletter, March 15, 2025**

Our 2025 Trustees' meetings have covered a lot of business this year, and I want to share some of it with the congregations.

We began the year by accepting Ed Paap's resignation as Chair and approving his video membership. His family responsibilities have increased while his wife is in Vietnam. We elected Danny Nguyen as the new Chair. We are grateful that Danny has stepped up, and we are off to a running start.

The last time I wrote, Wi-Fi, homelessness, and the kitchen were the big issues. Here is the status of these issues. I will report on other exciting subjects in a future edition of "Trustees' Times."

**Wi-Fi** We are making progress toward resolving the Wi-Fi connectivity problems. The slow pace is due to technical issues, and our 8-inch-thick concrete walls.

**Homelessness** is still a challenge, but some protection for our property has been instituted. We are renting our parking lot, which has become a major source of income and makes the parking lot so busy that it is less accessible for the homeless.

Some parts of our grounds, especially the palm tree and other greenery at the northeast corner of the Sanctuary have been a preferred place for homeless personal use, sleeping, and other nefarious activities. Having volunteers repeatedly clean up the mess, is not safe or sustainable so the Trustees removed some of the greenery, which eliminates the hiding place.

The sidewalk approach to the glass doors into the Narthex has become a sleeping and storage place for the homeless. Since this area is not visible from the street, the police don't remove the encampment. Some of the obstructions at the front of the church will be trimmed or removed to resolve this problem. An open view will make our front door visible and welcoming to people looking for a church home.

**Kitchen** The kitchen had a lot of greasy build-up and required hard labor cleaning. The problem was so grave that I was concerned it might be the source of food-borne illness. Other Trustees were worried about potential falls on the slippery, greasy floor, fire hazards, and rodent attraction. Trustees who have valiantly tried to stay ahead of this problem are no longer physically able to do such massive clean-ups. Thanks to two generous donations and Danny's endless list of resources, he was able to schedule a "deep cleaning" by a commercial restaurant cleaning company. They finished the job in one night and left the kitchen clean and safe. Danny has set up a routine so all users can document that they have left the kitchen clean and orderly.

**Concerns Coordinator** Chair Danny Nguyen appointed me to act as liaison between church members, staff, and Trustees. We hope our work will make the congregation happy, but we also know that we make decisions that may be of concern to our members and guests. If you see a problem that Trustees should be considering or if you are unhappy with some part of the church property, please leave a message in the office or talk with me, either before or after the Sunday service, and tell me of your concern(s). Sometimes just knowing why we made a decision will make you feel better.


